This multidisciplinary symposium focuses on issues specific to sexual intimacy and fertility in patients receiving device therapies, cardiac or lung transplantation.



Yesterday kicked off the first day of ISHLT2021, bringing more than 2,500 attendees together from around the world. Highlights can be found below.

Opening Plenary Session Gathers Worldwide ISHLT2021 Audience

The opening plenary session yesterday was the first gathering of the entire ISHLT community since 2019. The session featured reports from **Peter Hopkins, FRACP**, ISHLT Program Chair, and **Joseph Rogers, MD**, ISHLT President.



The centerpiece of the plenary was a riveting keynote address from **Richard Harris, MD**, an anesthesiologist who was instrumental in the rescue of 12 boys, aged 11 to 16, from the flooded Tham Luang Nang Non Cave in Chiang Rai province in Thailand. The session outlines one of the most extraordinary international rescue efforts in modern history, a triumph of meticulous planning and preparation against relentless logistical challenges... and, as Dr. Harris said, "a slightly offlabel use of ketamine."

Following on the theme of managing adversity, **Tiago Machuca**, **MD**, **PhD**, presented a featured abstract entitled *International Experience with Lung Transplantation for COVID-19 associated Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome*. The presentation explores listing criteria, results, intraoperative challenges, and outcomes post-transplant. **Andrew Fisher, PhD, FRCP**, led a Q&A discussion with Dr. Machuca after the presentation of the abstract.

Although Richard Harris's lecture was a one-day-only engagement, the rest of the plenary session will be available for on-demand viewing on the platform until Friday, 30 July, 2021.

2020 Lifetime Achievement Award Winners: Laudation and Recipient Lecture



At the end of the plenary session, ISHLT recognized the recipients of the 2020 Lifetime Achievement Award. **Jack Copeland, MD**, ISHLT Past President, presented a moving laudation of 2020 Lifetime Achievement Award winner **Michael Hess, MD**, one of the founders of ISHLT and its first President, who died in 2019.

Jim Kirklin, MD, the second 2020 Lifetime Achievement Award winner, presented a recipient lecture to close the plenary session, entitled "The History of ISHLT: Through the lens of pioneers, Presidents, and prescient luminaries." His talk explored a historical perspective of ISHLT, focusing in part on the many visionaries who have led the Society at various points in its history.

The talk also highlighted some of the most important breakthroughs and milestones in the Society's history, such as the creation of the Journal of Heart and Lung Transplantation, the genesis of the Caves Award, and much more. Thank you to Dr. Kirklin for all of his contributions to the Society!



- Sensitization in Heart-Kidney Transplantation, presented by Darshana Dadhania, MD, of Weill Cornell Medicine, New York, NY USA
- Interdisciplinary Management Strategies for Cardio-Renal Syndrome: Tools in our Arsenal, presented by Michael M. Givertz, MD, of Brigham & Women's Hospital, Boston, MA USA
- The Ethics of Dual Organ Transplantation: Evaluating Fairness in Organ Allocation, presented by **Jayme Locke**, MD, MPH, of the University of Alabama at Birmingham, Birmingham, AL USA
- Partners for Life: Monitoring and Caring for the Heart and Kidney Allografts, presented by Luciano Potena, MD, PhD, of the University of Bologna, Bologna, Italy

The symposium overall generated an interesting conversation about shared concerns, challenges, and issues across heart and kidney transplantation. If you missed it, the session will be available for viewing on-demand until 30 July, 2021.
