8:00 – 9:30 a.m. EDT: **ORAL SESSION 29: Philip K. Caves Award Candidate Presentations** (ALL)

This can't-miss session features presentations of the abstracts that have been nominated for the 2021 Philip K. Caves Award. Named after the clinician who developed and pioneered the technique of transvenous endomyocardial biopsy to assess for rejection after cardiac transplantation, the Caves Award was established in 1982 to encourage and reward original high quality research performed by trainees, residents, fellows, and graduate students. 9:45 - 11:15 a.m. EDT: **SYMPOSIUM 29: What Has COVID Taught Us About MCS? Lessons from 2020 for 2021**(MCS)

This COVID-focused session may be of interest both inside and outside of MCS interdisciplinary teams. It will describe the use of ECMO in patients with COVID 19 and infection in patients on MCS, and move on to discuss what we can learn from the pandemic to improve and streamline our management of VAD patients going forward. Telehealth was successful during the pandemic—can it be used more going forward? How can better virtual monitoring and Cardiomems help in their care?

3:00 – 4:00 p.m. EDT: **WORKSHOP 13: Advances in the Microbiome: The Secret World Inside Us** (HEART)

A hot topic, to be sure—the human body is home to a multitude of niche environments, each with their own unique microbiome. The most researched of these is the gut microbiome; although our understanding of this symbiotic relationship has stemmed from gut-based research, it has developed to include the reciprocal relationships between the gut and other organs including the heart and lung. Joint Symposia: ISHLT/PVRI: Of Mice and Men

Monday featured the second of three joint symposia at ISHLT2021, featuring a collaboration with ISHLT and the **Pulmonary Vascular Research Institute (PVRI)**. This joint symposium featured four individual talks:



- Journey to the Center of the Cell: New Pathways and Beyond, presented by Sebastien Bonnet, PhD, FAHA, of Laval University
- Intolerable Cruelty or Why Phase II Trials Failed, presented by Olivier Sitbon, MD, of Université Paris-Saclay
- Facing the Void: How Do We Define Success in PAH?, presented by **Jean-Luc Vachiery, MD**, of CUB Hôpital Erasme
- The Full Monty: Tools and Tricks for a Better Management, presented by Raymond Benza, MD, of The Ohio State University

The symposium highlighted a key area of convergence between the two society, and explored the evolution of the management of PAH. The panel discussion with all four speakers was a fascinating highlight, bringing researchers from four countries together to find common ground and explore challenges on this key clinical issue. COVID-19 Symposium Features Live Talks; Oral Session Explores Delivery of Care

Yesterday featured two COVID-19 focused sessions: Symposium 22 and Oral Session 20.

The COVID-19 symposium, *Calculus, King Lear, and COVID-19: Innovations During Plagues*, brought six invited speakers together for a range of talks exploring relevant scientific, societal and epidemiological challenges with COVID-19 infection, especially in the context of providing care to those with advanced heart or lung disease.

Talks included:

- The Pandemic Response Interplay between Science, Politics and the Media, presented by Ilaria Capua, DVM, PhD
- Long-Term Outcomes of Transplant Patients with COVID-19, presented by Jonathan Messika, MD, PhD
- Solidarity Trial: Challenges in Setting Up Global Clinical Trials in a Pandemic, presented by **John Rottingen**, **MD**, **PhD**, **MSc**, **MPA**
- Lung Transplantation for COVID-19 Respiratory Failure, presented by Ankit Bharat, MD
- Challenges and Controversies in Developing a COVID-19 Vaccine, presented by Michael Ison, MD
- The COVID Pandemic: The Evolving Reality Epidemiologic Perspectives, presented by Michael Osterholm, MD

The final two talks of the symposium were presented live, to allow for the ever-changing nature of these issues. These live presentations included Q&A and will be available on demand until 30 July, 2021.



Together, these abstracts provided a look at how the pandemic has affected cardiac treatment over the past year—not just due to SARS-CoV-19 infections, but how COVID has impacted the cardiac care system overall. This session will be available on demand until 30 July, 2021.






